Plant Description

Kiwi, also known as *Actinidia deliciosa*, is a fast-growing vine that produces creamy white flowers in late spring and delicious, nutritious fruits. This vine prefers full sun to part shade and well-draining, loamy soil with high watering requirements. Kiwi plants are vulnerable to root rot, aphids, and leaf spot. With dark green foliage and a spread of 3-4 meters, Kiwi is a great addition to trellises or arbors in the garden. Additionally, its unique ability to attract butterflies makes it a popular choice for edible landscapes. Consider planting Kiwi alongside grapes, climbing roses, or honeysuckle for a beautiful and fruitful garden display.
