Plant Description

Raspberries are delicious perennial plants that produce tasty red fruits. They are fast-growing and prefer moderate watering and full sun. Raspberries have white flowers that bloom in the summer, attracting pollinators to the garden. They are versatile plants that can be used for edible fruit production, as a hedge plant, or to create wildlife habitats. Raspberries are relatively low maintenance and can thrive in loamy soil in hardiness zones 3-8. They are susceptible to pests like aphids and Japanese beetles, as well as diseases like powdery mildew. Consider planting raspberries with companion plants like blueberries and strawberries for a bountiful berry garden.
